

# Lead Gift Launches Expansion

## ***New DMACC Ankeny Campus facility to be Named Karl Chevrolet Automotive Technology Center***

Carl and Penny Moyer, owners of Karl Chevrolet in Ankeny, provided a lead gift of \$1 million to kickstart the renovation and expansion of the facility that houses the automotive and collision training programs on the DMACC Ankeny Campus.

When completed in 2020, the new \$12 million, state-of-the-art facility will be called the Karl Chevrolet Automotive Technology Center at DMACC.

"I have a great passion for

DMACC. I can remember when the first building on the campus was built many years ago, to what it is today. They were the only college around offering an automotive program that allowed interns to work at a dealership and get hands-on experience, and over the years we have hired many great employees from them here at Karl Chevrolet," Carl says.

"The future of this college and its automotive program means a lot to me and even more to our community here in Ankeny," he continues. "DMACC's dedication to our industry and our young people relies on what is being accomplished every day just down the street. This is why

Penny and I personally want to ensure a strong future for their automotive program with our donation to their expansion."

The ambitious project will renovate and expand on the more than 60,000-square-foot Automotive Technology Center. Specific improvements include:

- New classrooms and student lounge
- An additional 22 vehicle work bays
- Renovation of nine classrooms
- Conference Rooms and a showroom to improve the visitor and prospective student experience

"Carl and Penny Moyer are great friends to DMACC and our automotive program," says DMACC President Rob Denson. "We're proud to call them friends. This gift says it all."

# Hensley Feels Right At Home Under the Hood

Kim Hensley didn't know exactly what she wanted to do for a living, but she knew that the job she was in wasn't it. Seeking a new career path, she began to think about what kind of work excited her.

"I was really in need of something new," the 27-year-old says. "It sounds funny, but I was always curious about cars, but was never surrounded by people who could teach me anything about them. So, I decided to find a program that could teach me."

Hensley settled on DMACC's Automotive Technology program. Now more than a year into it, she says it was absolutely the right decision for her—even if she is one of just a small handful of women in the program.

"Part of what I wanted to do was to open doors and open the eyes of other women by showing them this is an industry they could thrive in," Hensley, who is comfortable bucking stereotypes, says.

"I'm in no way a 'gear head'," she says with a laugh. "I just want to fix stuff. There is so much more thinking and finesse that go into this kind of work. At DMACC they emphasize that. It's not just swinging a hammer. It's about learning how things work and how to put them back together."

She credits her instructors with keeping her moving toward her ultimate goal of putting her newly acquired knowledge to work.

"I could be discouraged being a woman in a traditionally male dominated field, but I'm not," she says. "A lot of that has to do with how supportive everyone is at DMACC. They push me to want to be as good as I can possibly be."

## Fitting Tribute Will 'Light the Fire' for the Next Generation of Auto Enthusiasts

For decades, Corvette drivers from across Iowa knew that when they cracked or shattered a fender, care for their beloved car was only a call away. Dick Mathern was the one on the other end of that call, assuring owners of the high-powered sports cars that he would provide the tender loving care their ride needed at his renowned Corvette Hospital.

"Over the years, we had several incidents where we had to take our 1972 Corvette to Dick's hospital," says Jay Hommer. Jay and wife, Linda, became friends with Dick and his wife Arda through the Corvette Club of Iowa (CCI). "Dick was an absolute genius with fiberglass."

### Building a Reputation

Arda says Dick, who passed away at age 72 in 2011, was a graduate of old Tech High in Des Moines and gained a mastery of fiberglass—classic Corvette bodies are made of the material—by helping a friend.

"His friend had a shop in downtown Des Moines and that's where he learned the trade," Arda says. "He would work for free just to pick up the skills. Eventually he took over that small shop."

Dick also took a number of classes at DMACC and even taught a fiberglass class for one semester in the Automotive Technology program. Jay says that Dick earned his reputation as the go-to guy for the "particularly particular" Corvette owners in the region.

"He performed magic on our car more than once," Jay says. "And I don't know how you would even put a number of the amount of cars he worked on in this area. Virtually every classic Corvette in and around Des Moines, Dick had his hands on at some point."

### Honoring a Legacy

When Dick passed away, it was a huge hit to the tight-knit CCI. Jay was quick to look for opportunities to memorialize him and offer club members and friends the opportunity to show their respect for what Dick meant to the community.

As a long-time supporter of the DMACC Alumni Association, Jay thought it would be fitting to honor Dick's memory with a scholarship for students of the DMACC Automotive Technology program. When he approached Arda about the idea, she fully supported it.

"I'm so happy about what this scholarship has become," Arda says. She and Jay have the honor of reviewing scholarship applications each year. "I was surprised when Jay first brought the idea to me, but it couldn't be more fitting. There was no one who was crazier about cars than Dick. He knew the pedigree of every Corvette in this area."

## A Lasting Impact

The initial scholarship was funded through private donations and special events. Jay and Linda provided an anchor gift, and a number of CCI members were regular donors. The first award was made for the Spring 2013 semester.

After working to fund it for a couple of years, it became clear that there was enough support to work toward raising the funds required to endow a \$1,000 scholarship in perpetuity.

Jay put out the word that an endowment was the goal, and those who loved and respected Dick responded.

"We got it done," Jay says. "And it is a special kind of scholarship. If you look at the criteria, there aren't any huge hurdles to earn it. We are aiming at the regular student who could use a little help paying for school."

Arda and Jay agree that the scholarship is having an impact on a vital program.

"It is important to have a strong automotive program available

to students looking to learn a trade," Arda says. "This has been the perfect way to honor Dick by ensuring that students have a helping hand in gaining skills in a trade that he loved."

"Not everyone needs a four-year degree to be successful," Jay adds. "Helping these students gain the experience of fixing what's broken is vital. Dick was able to do that and that is why this is such a fitting tribute."

## Remembering a Loved One With a Gift

Establishing a scholarship through the DMACC Foundation is one way you can assist students and leave a legacy to the College. It's also a very meaningful way to honor family and friends. As a scholarship donor, you choose the name of the scholarship as well as the criteria. The following is a guide to establishing a scholarship at the DMACC Foundation:

### STEP 1: Determine the level of support you wish to provide.

- Annual scholarships begin at \$1,000 and are

funded on a year-by-year basis by the donor(s). The Foundation asks donors to make a five-year commitment when establishing a new annual scholarship.

- Endowed scholarships support themselves in perpetuity. The initial gift is invested, and the scholarship awards are determined each year by the Foundation's Endowment Spending Policy.

- The minimum investment for an endowed scholarship is \$25,000.
- Other scholarships may be awarded for one or two years from a specific donation.

### STEP 2: Determine the focus of your scholarship.

- Foundation staff will assist you in developing the scholarship criteria. Criteria might include a specific program, academic standing or

financial need.

- Scholarships can be named in honor or memory of an individual or organization.

### STEP 3: Sign a scholarship agreement with the DMACC Foundation.

## DMACC Grad Recognizes Value of Roots

The seed for starting his own business was planted at DMACC for Clint Dudley. A graduate of DMACC's Automotive Technology program, there was one assignment in particular that he credits with the inspiration for what today is his own shop: Shade Tree Auto.

"In my shop management class we spent some time designing our own shop," the 1999 graduate says. "Now, twenty years later, I am pretty much working in the shop I sketched out back then. I wish I still had those plans just so I could see exactly how close to my vision back then that this is."

Dudley opened Shade Tree Auto, located in Grimes, as a side business back in 2001. After juggling a full-time job and the increasing demand for his side work, he made the decision in 2004 to jump in with both feet, making Shade Tree Auto his sole focus.

"I don't feel like I'm any different than anyone else who went through the DMACC program when I did," Dudley says. "There's nothing wrong with a four-year degree, but it's also not a requirement to be successful. Along with myself, about half of the employees at Shade Tree Auto are DMACC graduates. We're the number one small retail company in the world this year [story below]. I'm hoping the students at DMACC realize how far they can go, it's really amazing."

He says the care of automobiles has changed considerably in the last decade-plus, with it being common for newer cars to have as many as 100 million lines of computer code built in. The evolution has made it important to find employees who have completed the high level training offered in programs like DMACC's.

"We are very fortunate to be so close to DMACC," Dudley says. "I hear from shop owners like me around the country about how tough it is to find good, qualified employees. We are literally just a few miles away from a program that is not only recognized locally for the quality of education it provides, but is recognized nationally."

## 2018 Small Business Award Winners

### Entrepreneurship Competition Winner

#### *Quick Covers*

Invented by Luke Shaffer and Zach Kowalik, Quick Covers are precision-molded plastic covers that fit snugly over rusty areas on vehicles. They restore the original appearance at a fraction of the cost of traditional repair. And, because they are plastic, they can never rust. Quick Covers are installed with a combination of automotive-grade adhesive tape and fasteners in a matter of hours.

#### *Below Farm and Auto Restoration*

Founded by Logan Below, Below Farm and Auto Restoration is located in Hubbard, Iowa. Logan has been providing auto body services since he was 12 years old. Upon earning his degree from DMACC in 2007, he worked for a short period of time in a shop before opening his own business. The Below team offers a variety of restoration services, all focused on the specific needs of customers.


