Together Again ... Thank You for Your Support of DMACC Students!



Investing in Excellence

Passion meets purpose as Albaughs provide generous support for DMACC students and programs.

The thing about extravagant visions is that while many people are excited by them, only a select few have the passion, purpose and expertise to bring them to fruition.

Dennis Albaugh is one of those few.

The son of Dean and Lorna Lee Albaugh, Dennis was raised on a farm just northeast of Ankeny. He gained an appreciation for hard work and a love for the land at a very young age. Coupling the lessons learned on that farm with his love for all things Ankeny, Albaugh has given life to a vision that exceeds the imagination of even the biggest dreamers.

A Love for This Land

As one of the wealthiest families in all of the Midwest, Dennis and his wife, Susan, could choose to set down roots anywhere. Their choice to headquarter their business here stems from a deep appreciation for the area in which Dennis and Susan were raised.

In Dennis's formative years, Ankeny was still a small town positioned close enough to Des Moines to have quick access to all of the conveniences of the big city, but far enough away that it retained its own identity. Out on the farm, Dennis's dad made sure he and his siblings gained an appreciation for hard work.

"My dad didn't believe in days off," Dennis says from the conference room of the headquarters of Albaugh LLC, which is located mere minutes from the farm where he grew up. "I was a farm boy, walking beans, baling hay, corn, crops, livestock, everything. We'd often work until after dark, go to bed and then get up and do it all over again. I loved it."

For Dennis, it fueled his passion for the land. Sure, he enjoyed heading out to the football game on a Friday night, or catching a show with friends, but he lived for his life on the farm and he loved everything about growing up around Ankeny.

A New Opportunity

While he loved life on the farm, Dennis was excited about the prospect of going to college and gaining additional knowledge and skills. As he was finishing high school, a "new" college opened its doors in his hometown, close to home.

Des Moines Area Community College (DMACC), which had launched in Des Moines in 1966, expanded to open its main campus in Ankeny in 1968, and it had an Agribusiness Operations program.

"My first classes were at the Ankeny Methodist Church," Dennis recalls. "But I was able to spend my last year in the first building [now Building #14]. It was neat to watch DMACC grow back then, and it is still neat to watch it grow today."

Dennis says he never considered going anywhere else.

"It was right there in my hometown," says Dennis, who received the first Agribusiness Operations degree DMACC awarded. "I was able to go to school and still live and work at home. I earned an ag degree there and that is where the seed for my main business got started."

The seed for Dennis's business was planted during one of several field trips led by his instructors at DMACC. He learned plenty during visits to fish hatcheries, feed mills and more. It was during this time that he learned about using chemicals to kill weeds—and a light bulb went on.

"When I was young, it was one of my jobs to go out in the fields and cut weeds," Dennis says. "When I saw how they were being treated by being sprayed and you could eliminate that manual labor, I was intrigued."

Shortly after completing his studies at DMACC, Dennis began work at a local grain cooperative, selling supplies to growers. He worked there for about seven years before he started to feel like life was getting "a little stagnant."

He continued to have an interest in the concept of the chemical



A Different Kind of Development

When DRA Properties, headed by Dennis Albaugh, set out to develop more than 1,000 acres near the geographic center of Ankeny, the vision was that it would provide more than just homes, shops, parks and gathering places. The vision was for a different kind of development—a development that gave back to its community.

With few examples of similar developments to guide them, Albaugh and his team jumped in to developing Prairie Trail in the area just north and west of the DMACC Ankeny Campus. At the heart of the development was the creation of a fund that would support educational endeavors at high schools in Ankeny and provide postsecondary scholarship support to students who are residents of the development.

"Education is an important part of every person's life," said Albaugh, a 1970 DMACC graduate, at a press conference (pictured above) announcing the scholarship fund in 2007. "I received my higher education degree on DMACC's Ankeny Campus. I am a firm believer in providing support for the students and teachers who live in Ankeny. The Prairie Trail Scholarship Program and mini-grant project is designed to accomplish just that."

The scholarship fund is now administered by the DMACC Foundation and awards scholarships annually to students attending DMACC or any other college in Iowa. To date, nearly 300 scholarships have been awarded through the fund, amounting to \$711,000 distributed to students since its inception.

treatment of weeds, and researched opportunities that could help him gain greater insight and experience in that niche. He eventually settled into a sales job with a chemical company. After about three years, he again began asking himself questions about his own future.

“I thought, why don’t I try this on my own,” Dennis recalls. “And the rest, as they say, is history.”

An Industry Leader

While Dennis’s first delivery as a business owner was memorable—for all the wrong reasons—he eventually found his stride. With Susan’s tireless support, Dennis grew the business steadily.

When the opportunity presented itself for Dennis’s company to produce a generic version of a popular herbicide and sell it nationally, then internationally, he jumped at the chance. From there, the business grew beyond anything Dennis or Susan could have imagined.

Their hard work and tremendous success allowed the Albaughs a number of opportunities. In addition to purchasing land in and around their beloved Ankeny, they began actively seeking opportunities to support causes throughout the area.

Giving Back

For the Albaughs, sharing their success has always been a priority. Dennis

and Susan are generous supporters of initiatives in Ankeny and across Iowa, and have nurtured a spirit of giving in their daughters’ families, both of whom have chosen to put down roots in Ankeny.

Among the first and largest gifts the Albaughs made was a \$250,000 donation to the State Historical Society of Iowa. On the heels of that gift came significant contributions to projects ranging from a Senior Center in Ankeny to renovations to the Ankeny High School football stadium. DMACC has also been one of the Albaughs’ philanthropic priorities.

In 2014, Dennis and Susan made a \$1 million lead gift in support of the expansion of the Iowa Culinary Institute. They also made a land transfer gift that made the FFA Enrichment Center on the Ankeny Campus a possibility, provided critical support for the expansion of the Karl Chevrolet Automotive Technology Center and Health Sciences Building, and launched one of the most innovative scholarship programs anywhere in the country.

A Vision to Give Back to the Community

Located just north and west of the DMACC Ankeny Campus, Prairie Trail is a 1,031-acre planned community built on the tradition of Iowa’s great town centers and neighborhoods. It’s a tapestry of diverse and distinctive homes,

neighborhood stores, nearby offices, a library, schools and parks. It’s a walkable development with less traffic, more sidewalks and trails that connect the entire development to the City of Ankeny and beyond.

Developed by the Albaughs’ DRA Properties, it also serves a philanthropic purpose. The land on which the development is built sits near the geographic center of Ankeny. It could have been parceled into a thousand different purposes, but the Albaughs had a vision.

“We were looking to bring connectivity to the entire community,” Dennis says. “We wanted to create something that gave Ankeny a whole new distinction and destination. We wanted a true dynamic town center and we wanted it to be a champion for small businesses. We wanted to do it right.”

The value of the Prairie Trail development and improvements currently total more than \$500 million.

Behind Dennis’s leadership, they achieved the vision. And more.

The Innovative Prairie Trail Scholarship

Along with a new economic and residential district in town, the Albaughs added a philanthropic twist with the creation of The Prairie Trail Scholarship.

Its purpose is to provide financial

support to those pursuing post-secondary schooling. Scholarship awards are available to residents and the dependents of property owners of the entire Prairie Trail Development. Selected recipients are eligible for a maximum lifetime award of \$10,000 for their education. Students attending Des Moines Area Community College (DMACC) are eligible for a maximum lifetime award of \$12,000. The general scholarship is distributed in increments of \$2,500 per year (\$1,250 for each of two consecutive semesters). Students attending DMACC can receive \$3,500 per year (\$1,750 for each of two consecutive semesters). Scholarship preference is given to students who attend an accredited two- or four-year educational institution in Iowa.

In 2007, the Albaughs committed \$100,000 as the initial deposit into the fund. Additional funding for the scholarship program is generated by a 1/2 of 1% fee on the transfer (sale or resale) of all real property within Prairie Trail. The fund is managed by the DMACC Foundation.

‘My Favorite University’

The Albaughs’ fond spot for DMACC goes back to Dennis’s college days. To this day, he appreciates the quality education he received and the way his schooling at DMACC prepared him to launch what is today an international business.

“I got to watch that first building go up on the DMACC campus and I was able to spend my last year in that first building,” Dennis says. “I tell everyone that DMACC is my favorite university in the state of Iowa.”

Having the resources to give back in such a big way provides the Albaughs a great feeling.

“You work hard and you earn money, and then all of a sudden you figure out you have an opportunity to give back,” Dennis says. “We’ve been fortunate to give back a lot over the years and we still have more to give. It’s just a very rewarding feeling to give back to this town. Ankeny has given us so much and we are humbled to pay it back.”

Loyal to DMACC, Iowa

Whatever the future holds for DMACC and its students, the Albaughs are sure to be a big factor in it. In addition to their capital gifts and the establishment of the innovative Prairie Trail Scholarship, Dennis also serves on the DMACC Foundation Board of Directors and hosts one of the Foundation’s biggest fundraisers at his Talons Golf Course. Now preparing for its 15th year, the event has raised more than \$3.6 million for student scholarships, averaging more than \$400,000 annually for the one-day event.


Humble as always, Dennis says he is just happy to help his college, his hometown and his home state continue to thrive.

“I’ve achieved a lot of success right here in Iowa, and I’ve given a lot of it back right here in Iowa,” he says. “I want to continue to do that. As I’ve gotten older, I’ve continued to look for projects that have a positive impact on the community. Our vision is to keep doing that.”

Zahnar Orynbay

In her native Kazakhstan, Zahnar Orynbay was a teacher. When she married in 2013 and moved to the United States, she knew she would have difficulty teaching in her new country.

“I have dyslexia, so teaching math in my third language was not going to be possible,” she says. “I visited with the advisors at DMACC and they recommended that I try accounting. My goal is to have a better life here in America and that depends on a good education.”

Zahnar feels like she is receiving that good education at DMACC.

“I am really thankful for my professors,” she says. “They are so passionate about their classes and so willing to spend time to help students out, especially students like me. From my teaching background, I know how important that is.”

A DMACC Foundation scholarship recipient, Zahnar says the financial support has also been important.

“The scholarship allows me to work part-time so I can spend more time on my schoolwork,” she says. “Without a scholarship, I would have to work full-time. This speeds up the time it takes to get my degree.”

Pursuing *Excellence*

Generous support from private donors ensures students can dream big

Kylie Rink

Kylie Rink, whose career goal is to be a teacher, has been helped tremendously by DMACC Foundation scholarships.

“I come from a low-income family, so without scholarships, I’m not sure I could afford to go to college,” she says. “The scholarships have helped me to pay for my classes, but not just that. They have also helped me with my books and some other expenses so I can focus on my studies.”

Inspired to become a teacher by some incredible instructors while she was in high school, Rink says she has also been motivated by those leading her classes at DMACC.

“I think I am even more motivated now than I was in high school,” Rink says. “DMACC is really good at keeping you engaged in your classes and wanting to learn more. Over the years, a number of teachers have become like family to me. That has made it my goal to go back and teach at my old high school or somewhere in this area.”



Mackenzie Campfield

After graduating from Lincoln High School in Des Moines in 2014, Mackenzie Campfield decided that college wasn't for her. But after a few years of working, Mackenzie couldn't shake the feeling that she wanted to be back in the classroom—first as a student and eventually as a teacher.

“One morning I woke up and said to myself, ‘Why am I not an elementary teacher,’” she says. “I love teaching children. Both my mother and stepmother ran in-home daycares, so kids have always been a natural part of my life. It is my dream to put my passion for guiding children to work as a teacher.”

DMACC scholarships have been instrumental in helping Mackenzie make ends meet.

“Scholarships have helped me tremendously,” she says. “Rather than focusing on picking up another shift, I can pick up another course to help me move closer to my career goal more quickly.”



Brandt Damman

When Brandt Damman started his studies on the DMACC Boone Campus in the fall of 2018, it was brand new experience. A home school student, Brandt had taken four DMACC classes during his high school years, but being on campus daily was an eye-opener.

Brandt jumped into campus life with both feet, joining a number of organizations including the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society, the Student Activities Council, the Social Justice Club, the newspaper, theater group and more.

Brandt says choosing DMACC was perfect for him, especially with the help he received from the DMACC Foundation.

“The scholarships reduced the financial burden I was facing,” Brandt says. “Every little bit helps and I am very thankful for the support of the Foundation, my instructors, the faculty and everyone on campus. I felt fully supported at all times.”



Keely Murphy

After a couple of starts and stops, Keely Murphy is closing in on completing her studies and moving into the workforce full-time as an automotive technician.

Keely says she is excited for what the future holds.

“I've always had an interest in cars, and it is a really good profession and job market,” she says. Keely currently works part-time at an all-female auto repair shop in Clive.

Keely is thriving in the program now, which is made possible in part by support from a DMACC Foundation scholarship.

“I'm a single mom and I work as well as going to school,” she says. “And when I'm in school full-time, I can't get as many hours at work. The DMACC Foundation scholarship, along with some grants and loans, have really helped. The scholarship especially because it means I don't have to take out as many loans.”

Looking back on her journey, Keely says she is proud to be where she is today.

“I didn't see myself going in the direction I am now a few years ago,” she says. “My family has always had financial problems so there wasn't any help for me to go to college. But now that I am in the program, there is so much support for me. From my instructors in the program, from my family and from my work.”





Funding Excellence

Scholarship Allocations by the Numbers



Scholarship allocations have increased steadily in the last decade, topping \$1 million for the first time during fiscal year 2017. The fiscal year 2022 allotment represents a record amount of support and a nearly 300% increase in support when compared to fiscal year 2013.

Through the DMACC Foundation, students from nearly 100 academic and technical programs receive scholarship support. Numbers below are from calendar year 2021.





Maximizing Your Impact

As DMACC President Rob Denson and his wife, Pat, were looking for ways to magnify the impact of their gifts to the College and its students, they learned of a unique giving opportunity that fit perfectly with their giving plan.

If you have an individual retirement account (IRA), at some point the federal government mandates an annual required minimum distribution (RMD) from that account, whether you need the income or not. But you have a unique opportunity to support your favorite nonprofit organization (DMACC) with those funds without paying a tax on the distribution, allowing more of the amount to go to DMACC. It's called a qualified charitable distribution (QCD).

A QCD is an option that Rob and Pat have now taken advantage of for several years and can be used for all or part of your RMD. Again, it's great because, as a QCD, the entire amount of the distribution goes to the College and no taxes are due or paid, increasing the amount of the gift at no cost to you.

"There will be some paperwork as you work with your bank or IRA holder, but it's worth it," Pat says. "Rob and I are very happy that this option is available to us. We love supporting the College and our DMACC students. Seeing them succeed gives us an incredible sense of pride."
