

## Director's Message

#### **Educating Iowans for Iowa.**

We recently came across this phrase in an annual report from 1978. The simple, straightforward phrase was prominently showcased on the cover and woven throughout the document—most notably in a quote from the first DMACC Foundation President, Norman Ackerman.

Now more than four decades removed from its first use in relation to DMACC, the phrase holds true today as the DMACC Foundation celebrates 50 years of service to the College and its students.

In 1972, DMACC leadership formalized the College's philanthropic efforts by establishing the DMACC Foundation. The purpose was simple: Assist needy students of all ages in obtaining a higher education.

In its first years of existence, the Foundation registered assets at \$123,000 and made a scholarship allocation of \$30,000 to students at the Ankeny, Boone and Urban Campuses—the College's only sites. What no one saw on the horizon was the substantial growth of the College.

With that growth, the DMACC Foundation has kept pace, increasing its fundraising efforts and capacity to provide funding for equipment, program enhancements and new buildings. Most important, the DMACC Foundation has held true to its founding purpose of

allocating

millions of dollars in student scholarships and growing our assets to more than \$24 million to ensure that students have access to the College's high-quality education and training.

As I reflect on the past 50 years of the Foundation, and my 11 years of service to the organization, I am reminded that we would not be able to sustain our growth or support for our mission without our donors—donors who believe that DMACC is a special institution, grounded in the community, embodying a group that believes in investing in one another benefits all.

Our collective legacy, marked by this milestone anniversary, reflects your generosity and advocacy in the interest of students. Thank you to all who continue to support **Educating Iowans for Iowa**. I hope you enjoy reading about your impact.



#### 1966

Des Moines Area Community College is founded. Since then, DMACC has grown from a metro Des Moines-focused, vocational and technical learning center into Iowa's largest community college, serving 11 counties and 75,000 credit and noncredit students annually on six campus locations and five learning centers.



#### 1972

The DMACC Foundation is formally established as the preferred giving channel to Des Moines Area Community College.

#### 1993

City of Newton donates \$1,000,000 and the Maytag Corporation donates a 100,000-square-foot building and six acres of land, valued at \$1,500,000, plus \$1,020,000 in cash to develop a campus in Newton, Iowa.

70s

#### 1975

The DMACC Foundation held its first fund drive, resulting in contributions totaling \$43,000 to be used for student scholarships and loans.

#### 1978

Property is acquired from the City of Des Moines for the construction of Urban Campus on the site it sits today. The new campus was opened to students in 1980.

#### 1986

The French Chef Exchange with Des Moines' French sister city St. Etienne, France, is established. The annual exchange is supported by the yearly Fleur de lys Gala and additional provided support.





# Altumni Share

#### Gabriel Glynn CEO & Co-Founder, MākuSafe®

Like many entrepreneurs, Gabriel Glynn's college journey took more than a couple twists and turns. He started at the University of Northern Iowa where he "tried a few different majors" before meeting the woman who would eventually become his wife. After marriage, the couple moved to Des Moines and Glynn began to give serious thought to starting a business of his own.

"I decided I wanted to start my own business or run my own business, and I thought I should go to school and learn what it would take to run a business," says Glynn, who enrolled on DMACC Ankeny Campus, taking most of his classes at night after working a full-time day job—and even doing some third shift work to make ends meet. "So that was really kind of the impetus behind going back to school."

While a student at DMACC in 2007, Glynn launched his first business with the assistance of one of his instructors, Tom West. The business quickly grew into a turnkey franchise and Glynn sold it in 2010. At the time, a social media wave was gathering and Glynn launched a software product that was effective as building prospect information from data mined off platforms like Facebook and Twitter. He eventually sold that business and started a couple others before co-founding his current business, MākuSafe\* in 2016.

MākuSafe\* is an award-winning Safety, Data & Analytics solution aimed at improving worker health, safety and productivity while reducing incidents and mitigating workplace hazards and risk exposures. The company now has 25 employees in seven countries. Glynn, who earned his Associate's degree at DMACC, credits his schooling for giving him the confidence to blaze his own trail.

"Every semester I was there because I really valued what I was getting out of it, and I really wanted to learn," Glynn says. "I felt like a lot of the folks around me were similar. They were there because they really wanted to be there and they really wanted to gain knowledge and education."

# Fond Memori

#### Katie Kuehner, DO Physician, Exemplar Care

Katie Kuehner, D.O., was interested in a career in medicine from a very young age. The Boone native's dad was a pharmaceutical representative and Katie loved their chats about his work.

"It was a natural fit for me," says Dr. Kuehner, who today is the Medical Director of Urgent Care at Exemplar Care in West Des Moines. "Knowing that I am going to make a difference in the life of patients is exciting to me."

Dr. Kuehner's career in medicine started while she was still a student at Boone High School. At the age of just 16, she enrolled in a chemistry class on DMACC Boone Campus.

"At the time, there wasn't a dual enrollment program between my high school and DMACC, but my parents encouraged me to give it a try," Dr. Kuehner says. "From that first class I took at DMACC, I was hooked. I actually ended up graduating from DMACC three weeks before I graduated from high school."

From DMACC, Dr. Kuehner went on to Iowa State, where she was able to graduate in just two years because of the credits she had amassed at DMACC. She completed medical school at Des Moines University before completing her residency in Las Vegas. Prior to joining Exemplar Care, she practiced Emergency Medicine for 11 years. She says she is thankful for her time at DMACC.

"I took so many classes at DMACC that set me up for success at Iowa State and eventually in medical school," Dr. Kuehner says. "When I was younger, I was interested in medicine. But it wasn't until I had the opportunity at DMACC to take that first chemistry class that I truly believed I could do it."

That confidence has served Dr. Kuehner well over the years. In dealing with urgent medical conditions on a daily basis, she has to be quick on her feet and ready for anything.

"I've never really done anything the traditional way, including enrolling in college while I was still a high school student," Dr. Kuehner says. "That continues with the way we approach care here at Exemplar Care. Providing care in an innovative way isn't something that scares me, because it's not something that's new to me."

Reflecting on the experiences that served as her career springboard, Dr. Kuehner has nothing but praise for DMACC.

"DMACC is the piece of the puzzle that changed my life," Dr. Kuehner says. "And I tell that to everyone who will listen."

#### Cheri Doane Director of Civic Engagement, Central College

As her children entered middle school, Cheri Doane began to consider the idea of returning to school. After doing a considerable amount of research, she decided to enroll at DMACC Newton Campus. It was a decision that served as a springboard in helping her pursue her passion as a career.

"I didn't go to DMACC with the idea that I was going to find a job and earn money," says Cheri, who enrolled in 1995. "In fact, when I decided to go back to school, it would have been easier to just find another job in Newton. Having a DMACC campus right there in town made it easy for me to decide that I wanted more than a job. I wanted to identify a vocation. A career. Something I could be passionate about."

Cheri earned her Associate's degree from DMACC, Bachelor's degree from Central College, and Master's degree from Iowa State University.

For more than two decades, she served in various leadership roles at Central College, most recently as the Director of Civic Engagement. Cheri retired at the end of the most recent school year and when she looks back on her distinguished career, she credits DMACC with providing her the tools and knowledge to find success both as a nontraditional student and a 40-something entering a new career way back in the 1990s.

"There is no question that DMACC played an instrumental role in where I am today," she continues. "Being back in the classroom at DMACC helped me with my vocational reflection and in gaining a better understanding of education. It also helped me see the way a college like DMACC or Central College has such a tremendous economic impact and contributes to the community well-being. All of that has continued to serve me well after I took my last class at DMACC."

In her role at Central College, Cheri developed community partnerships, provided faculty development, and oversaw academic service-learning and other civic engagement initiatives. In addition, she was involved in the development of service-learning at Central's Study Abroad programs in Europe and Mexico, which has been internationally recognized.

Now that she has entered retirement, she is looking to continue developing another passion—serving as an instructor at DMACC. Cheri has served as an adjunct instructor in Newton over the years and views teaching as an opportunity to give back to a college that gave her


Our online scholarship portal includes a comprehensive FAQ covering eligibility, the application process, how awards are made and more.
