Lloyd Hill, a Senior Vice President at American Equity Investment Life Insurance Company, speaks at a Black History Month presentation at the DMACC West Des Moines Campus. Hill, who grew up in Birmingham, Alabama, worked for the *Birmingham News* and later in Lyndon Johnson's administration. Hill said he attended an all-white college, Mississippi State, from 1958 to 1962. Hill served as the first director of Youth Opportunity for the city of Birmingham, helping find jobs for thousands of young people. Hill said he was in Atlanta in a meeting with Martin Luther King, Sr. and Alberta Williams King when

they were escorted from the room to be told that their son had been assassinated in Memphis. Hill served two terms on the DMACC Board of Directors and is the Past President of the DMACC Foundation.
