2	If applying for Ford ASSET, GM ASEP, HONDA PACT or MOPAR CAP programs: a. Secure dealership sponsor – tips are discussed in meeting with program chair.
3	If applying for Financial Aid - Submit FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) Any time after Oct. 1. Apply ASAP, the process can take 4-6 weeks. a Complete application online at www.fafsa.gov . DMACC ID Code: 004589. (Wait 3-5 days for e-mail from FAFSA and 2-3 weeks for mailed info from DMACC.) b Submit additional forms as requested by the DMACC Financial Aid office. c Accept terms and conditions. d Accept award. 5	Attend Orientation / Register for classes . <u>IMPORTANT!!</u> Once you sign up for orientation, <u>attend at your assigned time</u> . If you cannot attend, call Matt Schneiderman ASAP at 515-229-4951 to cancel/reschedule. If you do not show up at your assigned time and/or we don't hear from you, you may lose your spot in the program!
6	Pay tuition for classes. Verify tuition due date at time of registration. If receiving financial aid or scholarships, confirm award amount and tuition due dates.
7	 Purchase tools, books, and other class materials for the semester. a. Order tools by August 1st so they will be here by the first day of class. b. Bring your schedule to bookstore for book selection 10 days prior to semester.
