Alternative Credit Option for ECE 130: Emergency Care

Students may apply to receive alternative credit for ECE 130: Emergency Care if they are <u>currently certified</u> in each of the following:

- **CPR Certification:** Certification in infant, child, and adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) awarded by the American Red Cross or American Heart Association. This certification must include the live skills check-off to be complete.
- **First Aid Certification:** Certification in infant, child, and adult first aid awarded by the American Red Cross, American Heart Association, the National Safety Council, and Emergency Medical Planning (Medic First Aid).
- Mandatory Child Abuse Reporter Training (MCART) Certification
- Universal Precautions (UP) Certification (also referred to as Blood-Borne Pathogens or Standard Precautions)

Important Note: to be considered a "current certification" it must be valid for the entire semester in which the student is applying:

If you currently hold all of the above certifications and would like to pursue the alternative credit option, please complete the following steps:

- 1. Compete the *Credit by Experience Application*. This form is routed directly from Julie Clark via Dynamic Forms- please contact Julie to begin this process at jbclark4@dmacc.edu
- 2. Have electronic copies of your current training certificates for CPR, First Aid, MCART, and UP saved on your computer- please check that all certifications are still valid

Other Important Notes:

- To be eligible for the alternative credit process, the student's certifications must have been completed no more than two years from the date of submission of the application for alternative credit.
- A minimum of 12 credits must be earned at DMACC before alternative credit will be applied to the student's academic record.
- The student will be assessed an administrative fee of \$50
- Alternative credit requests cannot be made to replace a failing grade if the student has previously taken FCF 130
- Credits earned though this procedure are subject to the receiving institution's transfer credit policies
 and procedures. It is not guaranteed that all post-secondary institutions will recognize these credits.
