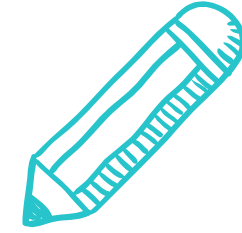


What is CCAMPIS?

Child Care Access Means Parents in School, or CCAMPIS, is authorized by the Higher Education Act and administered by U.S. Department of Education. This program supports the participation of low-income parents in postsecondary education through the provision of campus-based child care services.

With the CCAMPIS grant, the DMAACC Child Development Center outlined the following goals:

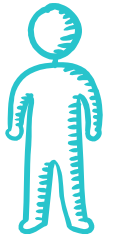
1. To expand the number of infant child care slots available
2. To provide childcare tuition assistance scholarships to low-income DMAACC students
3. To fund additional staff to support added child care slots
4. To improve the quality and availability of CDC materials, supplies, and professional development resources
5. To connect students to additional campus and community resources

How can CCAMPIS help me?



- CCAMPIS affects you directly by providing financial support to help you pay for child care expenses. With the CCAMPIS scholarship, you will have more time to focus on school work, college clubs, and school activities. This will in turn allow you more quality time to spend with your family.
- This program will also provide other support, such as informational workshops on families and parenting. With the help of your Pathway Navigator, you will receive guidance towards other resources, benefits, additional learning opportunities, and support.

When is my child care funded by CCAMPIS?



- When you're attending classes, labs, or field trips
- When you're studying on campus, working on class projects, or other college supported events
- When you're using services provided by the college (tutoring, computer labs, advising, counseling, the library, health services, academic achievement center, etc.)
- When you're participating in student club activities

How do I become and remain eligible?

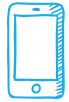


- ❑ Take SDV 108 within your first 2 semesters at DMACC
- ❑ Be enrolled at least half-time (6 credit hours)
- ❑ Have your child enrolled and attending at least 6 hours per day or 30 hours per week (if full-time tuition is provided by CCAMPIS)
- ❑ Provide a written report if any changes in the information provided on your application change within 5 days of the changes
- ❑ Maintain a 2.0 GPA
- ❑ Attend CCAMPIS parenting workshops
- ❑ Participate in CCAMPIS surveys each semester
